Workshop

Mayor Sanders called the workshop to order at 12:10 p.m.

Mayor Sanders moved to item 2 discuss and consider Code Enforcement, the difference between Code Enforcement Official, Code Enforcement Officer, and the duties that each can do.

Mayor Sanders moved to item 1 discuss and consider Ordinance No. 2014-04-04 – Recreational Vehicle Parks- AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANAHUAC, TEXAS REGARDING THE PLACING AND LOCATION OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKS TO BE LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF ANAHUAC, PROVIDING FOR AND EFFECTIVE DATE. Council gave input of changes to be made to the ordinance and it will be placed on the August 14th regular meeting agenda for discussion and action if any to be taken.

Mayor Sanders moved to item 3 discuss and status of festive ordinance. No meeting has been held yet.

Mayor Sanders moved to item 4 discuss and status of CLCND contract. No meeting has been held yet, but Alderman Thompson said himself and the City Attorney Richard Baker had spoke and reviewed the current contract and will suggest the City not sign the new contract and keep the current one we have with CLCND. Mayor Sanders asked this be place on the August 14, 2017 agenda.

Mayor Sanders moved to discuss and status of bridge on Oak Street. Alderman Thompson informed Council and Mayor that the bridge would be repaired by Chambers County and Trinity Bay Conservation District.
